The council's public website features a wide range of corporate information, including:

- Corporate plan and community strategy (information about how Ealing will achieve its vision) – from the homepage, click on 'Council & democracy' on the left-hand side, then click 'Corporate plan and community strategy'.
- Council news – on the homepage, or click on 'more news' on the main page. Around Ealing, the council's monthly residents' magazine is also available online, by clicking on the link on the right-hand side of the homepage.
- Equality and diversity (how the council is complying with its obligations under the Race Relations (Amendment) Act 2000) – from the homepage, click on 'Council & democracy' on the left-hand side, then click 'Equality and diversity'.
- Local councillors (full list of all Ealing councillors and the wards they represent) – from the homepage, click on 'Council & democracy' on the left-hand side and then click on 'Councillors'.
- Education – information for parents / carers / pupils on schools, financial assistance, school policies, and much more. Click on 'Education' on the left-hand side of the homepage.
