Tips to stop vaping

Gradual reduction

- Nicotine strength reduction: Option to reduce nicotine strength gradually (20mg-18mg-12mg-6mg-3mg-0mg).
 - o Pace: slower reduction is recommended for those in early stages or at risk of relapse, progressive goals for others.
- Time between vaping: Extend time between vaping sessions (e.g., 20 mins to 40 mins).
- Set vaping rules: Limit where and when you vape (e.g., only outside, not at home or in the car).

Options for Disposable Vape Users

- Switch to Tank System: Consider switching to a tank system for gradual nicotine reduction.
- Non-Nicotine Strategies: Use strategies like location and time restrictions.
- Alternate Nicotine Levels: Alternate between nicotine and zero nicotine disposables

Nicotine Replacement Products
