A PEP brings together professionals to focus on the child and information can be shared in a document and meeting. The PEP should be meaningful and focus on the child's achievements.

Intention

- Be ambitious
- Celebrate and praise CLA
- Plan interventions to support education and transitions
- Record attendance, attainment, behaviour, voices.

Implementation

- Key people together
- Termly
- SMART targets:
 - Specific
 - Measurable
 - Ambitious
 - Realistic
 - Timely: PEP to PEP
- Accurate and timely data
- CLA voice.

Impact

- Strong relationships with peers and staff
- Shared understanding between carers and professionals supporting educational outcomes
- Stability in school and placement
- Engagement in learning, improved attendance, attitude to learning score
- Attainment in line with children not in care (Close gap)
- Transitions support progress and attainment and life chances.
