# School Context

- Situation in one of the most deprived ward and areas of high transmission of COVID in Ealing
- a highly successful 11-19 mixed comprehensive school – Ofsted rating “Outstanding”, oversubscribed
- Over 1450 students from a variety of religions, faiths and countries (32 languages, 42 countries) with 986 students between the ages of 12-15
- Nearly a third of the students on Free School Meals
- Over 80% with English as an additional language
- Largely Asian and British Asian pupil population



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# What school did

## Communication with:

- local and NW London clinicians, reading documentation and understanding requirements
- parents – text messages with links, to information on website, emails, hardcopies of information, phone calls, information in Friday bulletin
- school staff – staff briefing, staff bulletin, communication with admin, catering, premises- for car parking and setup of work stations
- pupils – information during tutor time, information in pupil bulletin, hardcopies of leaflets
- Chair of Governors

## Personnel:

- School had a senior lead, meticulous coordinator and designated admin staff – clearly defined roles and responsibilities
- Student prefects – runners to collect students from classes at the right time
- Adequate supervision of students- effective and efficient members of staff

## Consent Forms:

- Adapted them to suit our need
- Included other requirement
- Aimed for 100% return even if not consenting
- Offer of help with language issue



# What school did

## Consent Forms

- Carefully checked all the forms for allergies, names, addresses etc.
- Grouped them in order to be called for vaccination
- Collated the numbers at the end of each day and checked if the numbers matched with the clinicians data

## Other:

- Provided refreshments and lunch for the team
- Parking space closest to the set up
- Rotation of staff



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# Impact

**Out of 986, 12-15 years old students:**

- Of those returned, 697 consented, 67 forms not returned, 214 declined, 8 not eligible
- 694 students vaccinated over 3 days - 246 the first day, 298 on the second day and 150 on the third day
- Those absent who will go their GPs

**No security issues**

**One anti vaccination communication**

**No staff concerns**

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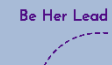
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# Consent data by Ethnic Group

Asian or British Asian	577	176	753	78%
Black or Black British	29	56	85	34%
Mixed /Dual Background	6	7	13	46%
White British/European	13	16	29	45%
Other Ethnic Heritage	58	23	81	69%
Unclassified	14	11	25	56%
<b>Totals</b>	<b>697</b>	<b>289</b>	<b>986</b>	<b>71%</b>
