# How do I earn points?

**-2**  
Points

- Not attending a training that you have signed up for (no penalty if you cancel within 48 hours).

**1**  
Point

- Complete a post-training evaluation survey
- Complete the annual health improvement survey

**2**  
Points

- Attend your Health in School Visit (HISV)
- Both headteacher and PSHE lead attends HISV
- Attend or host a network or training

**3**  
Points

- Attend the Health improvement annual conference
- Complete a 'student led' activity (see poster on EGFL)
- Write an article for Stepping Up to Health newsletter

**4**  
Points

- Present at a network, training or conference
- >75% of your staff complete the staff wellbeing survey

**5**  
Points

- Achieve your Sugar Smart School status
- Achieve a Healthy Schools London award

## What can I win?



In July 2024, four highschoools and four primary schools will win the following:

**1ST PLACE:** HAT membership + £50 gift for PSHE lead

**2ND PLACE:** £250 for your PSHE budget

**3RD PLACE:** £100 for your PSHE budget

**MOST IMPROVED:** The most improved primary & high school will receive £100 for their PSHE budget.
