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Core service

Implement an Ealing secondary school improvement strategy in partnership with schools and the Ealing teaching school alliance to support schools to raise achievement and close gaps through:

- ◆ Setting high aspirations for Ealing high schools with all schools judged to be at least good and an increasing proportion of outstanding schools
- ◆ Updating schools on local and national developments including interpreting policies and providing support to implement national changes. Half-termly meeting with headteachers
- ◆ Working with the research and statistics team to share data and analysis to highlight local trends and identify good practice
- ◆ Supporting schools to prepare for Ofsted inspection and follow up support and advice after inspection
- ◆ Completing risk analysis of school data and providing follow up advice and support including the securing good programme for schools that are less than good or at risk of being less than good
- ◆ Securing good monitoring visits

Deliver a Progression and pathways plan to ensure that all Ealing students have access to high quality post 16 provision

- ◆ Develop links across Council services and with external providers and employers in relation to post compulsory work based opportunities, employment and skills
- ◆ Support the implementation of local / national policy 14-19 developments
- ◆ Provide career leaders and senior leadership networks and advice

Review and evaluate service to make sure it meets the needs of schools, has impact and is value for money.

Annual buyback service

Provided by the ELP Quality & Partnerships Lead supported by senior associates and school-based staff, in partnership with the Ealing teaching school alliance.

The buyback service builds on the core service by providing a range of direct and brokered support to school leaders and staff with the aim of raising achievement closing gaps and building capacity in schools.

Ealing Teaching School Alliance (ETSA) services

- ◆ ETSA development plan with measurable outcomes for teaching school strands: ITT, CPD and school to school support
- ◆ ETSA steering group to monitor and review the ETSA development plan
- ◆ ETSA programme to improve the quality of teaching, learning and assessment, includes CPD programme, effective teaching and leadership group, strategic subject leads group
- ◆ Annual subject conference and subject leader networks in other terms
- ◆ At least one subject specific CPD or moderation session per network.

Leadership networks and development programmes

- ◆ Senior and middle leadership networks and programmes: (Deputy Heads, Senior leaders, Post 16, Inclusion, SENCo, EMA, Most Able)
- ◆ Support for subject network leads – national and local policy developments, data analysis and support for subject based conferences.

Link officer

- ◆ Personalised support for self-evaluation and risk management
- ◆ Headteacher appraisal: working with the headteacher and governors to review objectives for the past year and to set objectives for the current year.

- ◆ High quality data support for the partnership and for your school
- ◆ Bespoke data analysis for high schools on key stage 4 and post 16 including analysis of groups, transition data, attendance, exclusions etc.
