What is the Platinum Award?

An award unique to the borough of Ealing.

A award which celebrates how health and wellbeing are embedded in a school.

An award which celebrates sharing of good practice.



The Healthy Schools Ealing Platinum Award recognises good practice in demonstrating, sustaining (and learning from) outcomes and impact in supporting children and young people to achieve and maintain good health and wellbeing.

The steps to achieving Platinum

- Up to date Bronze HSL Award
- Up to date Silver HSL Award
- Up to date Gold HSL Award

Step 1:

Complete a new Silver HSL award.

achieve Gold.

Step 2:

Share your learning with other schools across the borough.

Step 3: Carry out a learning walk.

Healthy Schools London (HSL) Platinum Award

Criteria for achieving Platinum

Healthy Schools Ealing recognises good practice in demonstrating, sustaining (and learning from) outcomes and impact in supporting children and young people to achieve and maintain good health and wellbeing. In order to achieve the Platinum Award, school should:

1. Have achieved and maintained the HSL Bronze Award. This Bronze award will need to be up to date
2. Have achieved and maintained the HSL Silver Award. This Silver award will need to be up to date
3. Have achieved and maintained the HSL Gold Award. This Gold award will need to be up to date
4. Have completed a new Silver award – this will need to be different from the Silver used to achieve Gold Healthy School status
5. Share the learning from your Gold and Silver with other schools. For example, write an article for the Stepping Up To Health newsletter and/or present at any of the Health Improvement events.
6. Design a Learning Walk and promote this to other schools
7. Develop, organise and carry out a learning walk in your school to showcase your Gold activities
8. Evaluate your learning walk, by documenting what you carried out, how you developed the learning walk, how you recruited schools to attend the learning walk and evaluate the effectiveness of the learning walk.

Process for achieving Platinum

Schools must work with their Healthy Schools Borough Lead. The Borough Lead will work with the school to plan/implement action to achieve the Healthy Schools Ealing Platinum Award. The Borough Lead must approve the final application.

The Healthy Schools Ealing Team aim to provide notification to Platinum Award applicants within 4 weeks of the application being submitted.

If initially unsuccessful in their application, schools are allowed one re-submission.

Ealing will do 2 rounds of edits for you.
