



Good to Outstanding (G2O) professional development programme

Cohort Three: Autumn Term 2017

Number of schools: 6

Venues: Christ the Saviour CE and Gifford Primary Schools

Target Group: Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher/s from each school

This innovative programme has been developed for Ealing schools through a partnership between Dr Julia Coop (Athene Education), Outstanding Schools in Ealing and the Ealing School Effectiveness Primary Team. It is intended for primary **headteachers and deputy headteachers** who can evidence good educational provision in their schools but are keen to take extra steps towards securing an outstanding Ofsted judgement.

The programme has been refined and updated in the light of recent shifts in the educational landscape and feedback from previous cohorts.

Details of the programme

The programme comprises four practical sessions based in two outstanding Ealing Schools. The final session is followed by a day of bespoke consultancy based in each participating school. The purpose is to explore the practical application of skills and knowledge to help develop and embed outstanding practice in the school's context.

Sessions include:

- Realising Outstanding Leadership for Success: Lessons from research
- **Moving to Outstanding:** Sharpening self-evaluation skills and the school improvement planning.
- Developing a Positive Change Culture
- From Theory to Practice: Recognising outstanding provision, including teaching, learning and assessment

To consolidate the above delegates will be expected to complete a range of practical pre and post training tasks in collaboration with partner schools.

By the end of the course participants will be expected to

• Use rigorous monitoring and self-evaluation skills in order to successfully build capacity and drive continuous improvement;

- Reflect on strengths and areas to develop in their own professional practice;
- Undertake a personal, professional skills analysis linked to school improvement priorities;
- Identify the skills needed to build a strong team;
- Ensure school improvement activity is focused on securing high-quality provision and outcomes;
- Be confident in the use of key improvement planning tools;
- Possess up to date knowledge of the National Curriculum, current arrangements for assessment and the Common Inspection Framework;
