### WHAT IS BIKE WEEK?

**Bike Week**, organised by Cycling UK, takes place every year in June. The next bike week is 6th – I2th June 2022. Bike Week showcases cycling and how brilliant it is, and the many health and environmental benefits it brings.

Each year, thousands of people all over the country get on their bikes during Bike Week to experience the simple joy of riding a bike. The event can also be an effective way to prompt debate about transport-related concerns and an opportunity for schools to tackle local transport issues.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Did you know that taking part in the event is a great way to help boost your school's STARS accreditation level? Simply select the STARS Activity Card that corresponds to the activity you're running in school and share your story. **Bike Week** has its own activity card to get you started!

#### HOW DO I GET INVOLVED?

To do this, sign into your **STARS Online account**, select the activity from the list and click on 'Tell your story'. You can include photos, posters, newsletters, risk assessments and other relevant documents to show how your activity was completed. You can then publish your story in the 'Stories' section to share your achievements.
