





## STARS and London Climate Action Week 2022 – Activity Booster Sheet

## WHAT IS LONDON CLIMATE ACTION WEEK?

London Climate Action Week (LCAW) is an annual event, bringing together world leading climate professionals and communities across London and beyond to find practical solutions to climate change.

This year LCAW is taking place from 23 June to 3 July with many interesting events and workshops your school can join in.

Every London school is invited to take part so that your pupils are given the opportunity to understand more about climate change, London's risks and vulnerabilities. With many London boroughs having declared a state of climate emergency, the ambition is to help your pupils find the confidence to be active participants in the current climate conversation.

To help you plan the week, there are a number of practical resources and lesson plans available to you:

## HOW DO I GET INVOLVED?

To do this, sign in to your **STARS Online account**, select the activity from the list and click on 'Tell your story'. You can include photos, posters, newsletters, risk assessments and other relevant documents to show how your activity was completed. You can then publish your story in the 'Stories' section to share your achievements.

CONSULTATION	Identify a group of pupils who are keen to be your Young Climate Warriors for the week. This might be pre- existing group, such as your Eco Council or Junior Travel Ambassadors. Work together to plan the activities you'd like to run during the week.	Pupil Involvement
PROMOTION	Promote the activities and initiatives you'll be running during LCAW on your school's notice board and in staff rooms. Inform parents and carers about your school's involvement in LCAW by including information in newsletters and on your school's social media pages. CURRICULUM	<ul> <li>Using the resources linked at the top of this page, deliver a lesson or assembly on climate change and the environmental benefits of sustainable travel.</li> <li>Lessons might include:</li> <li>Working with pupils to take part in local democracy by contacting their local MP</li> <li>Exploring the key sources of air pollution at school, and identifying ways to tackle it</li> <li>Challenging pupils to measure local traffic speed, and identifying more sustainable travel options</li> </ul>	Environmental benefits of Active Travel
CYCLING WALKING	<ul> <li>As well as using LCAW to discuss what can be done to tackle climate change, use it as an opportunity to highlight how your school is taking action now.</li> <li>Examples of different STARS activities you could run during the week include: <ul> <li>Launch a cycling club to help encourage more pupils to cycle to and from school</li> <li>Record how pupils are travelling to school during LCAW and rewarding the class with the highest number of journeys travelled by sustainable methods</li> <li>Set up a Park and Stride scheme to give everyone the opportunity to walk at least part of their way to school</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Cycling club Other travel competition Park and Stride
