

Overview

The Think Equal programme has been created by global thought leaders in the fields of education, psychology, human rights and neuroscience, and comprises three age-appropriate levels, each containing 22 to 24 original narrative picture books, 90 lesson plans and accompanying resources. It has been designed and scaffolded based upon evidence gathered over the past six decades about what constitutes highquality, powerful intervention with lifetime effects.



Think Equal Summary

- Think Equal is a global initiative which calls for a system change in education, to end the discriminatory mindset and the cycle of violence across our world and ensure positive life outcomes for our children.
- Together with world experts, Think Equal has designed a programme to teach social and emotional learning to children 3 6-year-olds.
- The think Equal charity asks governments, policymakers and school networks to adopt, and ideally mandate, this programme as a new subject from the age of 3: the optimal window to modify attitudes, values and behaviours, based on evidence from neuroscientists.

We ask those who have a duty of care to our children:

....'How can it be deemed compulsory for a child to learn mathematics, but it is optional for that child to learn how to value another human being or to lead healthy relationships?'






The Curriculum Framework

- The Curriculum Framework outlines the pedagogical theories that underpin the Think Equal Programme, its theory of change, and the core components of the programme.
- 1. Included in it are the core tenets, which are the foundations upon which the programme is built: the belief in the child as an autonomous, empowered being; the active, constructive learning environment; positive, factual language; the concept of Ubuntu; (respect for human dignity, compassion and justice), the process of narrative; and social cognition.
- The document also outlines the six 'I Am' precepts, and the 36 topic areas through which children participating in the programme will develop.

These topic areas are:

- I Have A Strong Sense of Who I Am
- I Am Able to Look After Myself
- I Am Able to Look After Others
- I Am Able to Communicate
- I Am Able to Contribute and Create
- I Am A Critical Thinker.



School Programme

• The school programme is designed to be taught over 30 weeks of the school year.

• Each week of learning begins with a narrative picture book, followed by 3 x 30-minute lesson plans, with resources, per week.

Three Levels

- LEVEL 1 comprises 22 narrative books and accompanying activities for children aged 3-4. The level also includes material curated in partnership with the Center for Healthy Minds from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, which focuses on kindness and mindfulness.
- LEVEL 2 comprises 24 narrative books and accompanying activities for children aged 4-5. This level also includes material curated in partnership with SEE Learning from Emory University, which focuses on attention to the breath, body and trauma-informed teaching.
- LEVEL 3 comprises 24 narrative books and accompanying activities for children aged 5-6. This level also includes material curated in partnership with SEE Learning from Emory University, which focuses on attention to the breath, body and trauma-informed teaching.

Online Teacher Training

- Think Equal has a number of training modules designed for diverse settings: the online self-directed training platform (5 hours comprising 20 minute modules); a Zoom training with a Think Equal Master Trainer; and where no online connectivity is possible an in-person training.
- Think Equal has also partnered with a number of teachertraining providers, who complement our training with additional modules, aimed at the teacher's personal development, wellbeing and resilience.

TEACHER TRAINING

In order to equip teachers to effectively deliver this programme, we offer 5 hours of digital self-paced teacher training modules. 15 x 20 minute break the training into easy chunks.

We are also in the process of developing additional modules on early years mental health first aid - watch this space!

In order to reach children at home, and to facilitate parental engagement in the learning process, we have created home kit activities to compliment the classroom programme, further cementing the learning. Through the teachers, parents are sent 5 x 10 minute activities per week to enhance the classroom learning, and engage the parents in it.



Reaching the children in the classroom, with 30 weeks of evidence-based Social and Emotional Learning for mental health, wellbeing and social justice. We have also developed, with mental health specialists, a further Think Equal classroom programme which is trauma informed for refugee/IDP/conflict affected communities.
