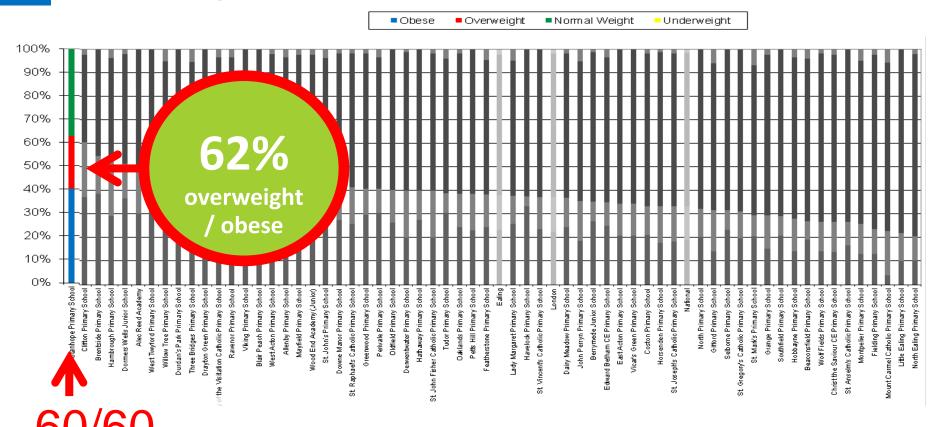
 2015 – in a position to now invest in health improvement and the school bought back the Health Improvement team for the first time

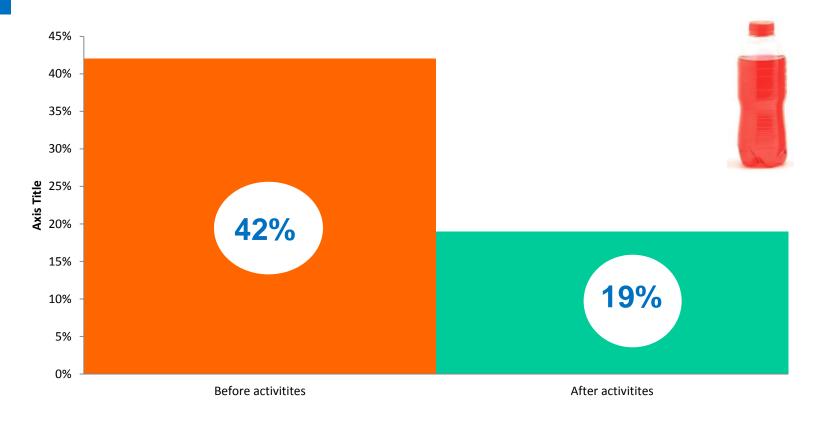

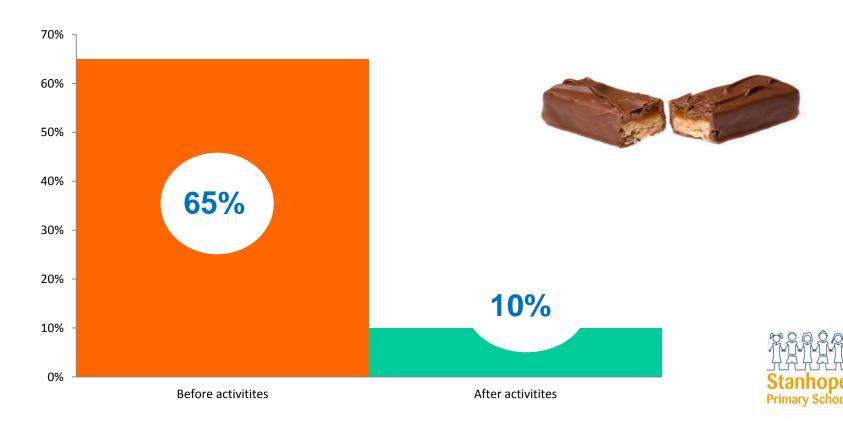
Impact of the activities June 2016 vs Jan 2016

% of pupils who drink sugary drinks at lunch

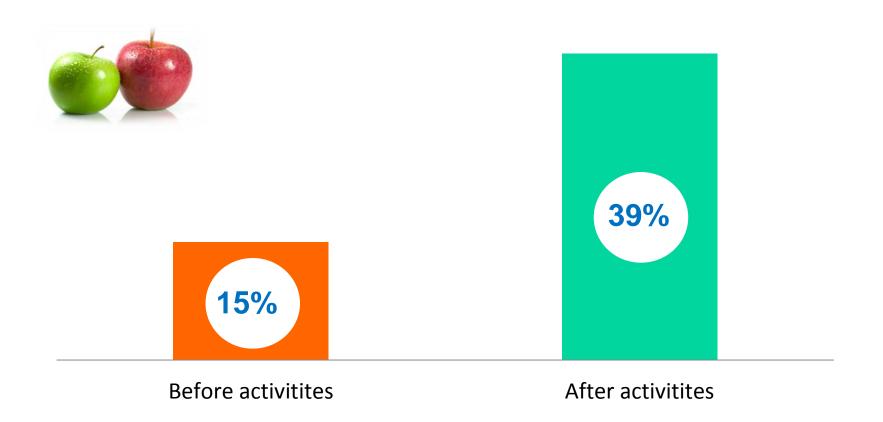




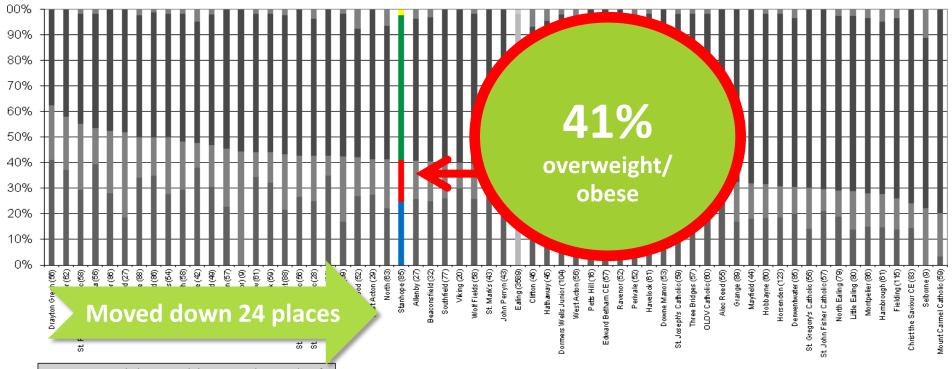
% of junk food in pupils lunchboxes

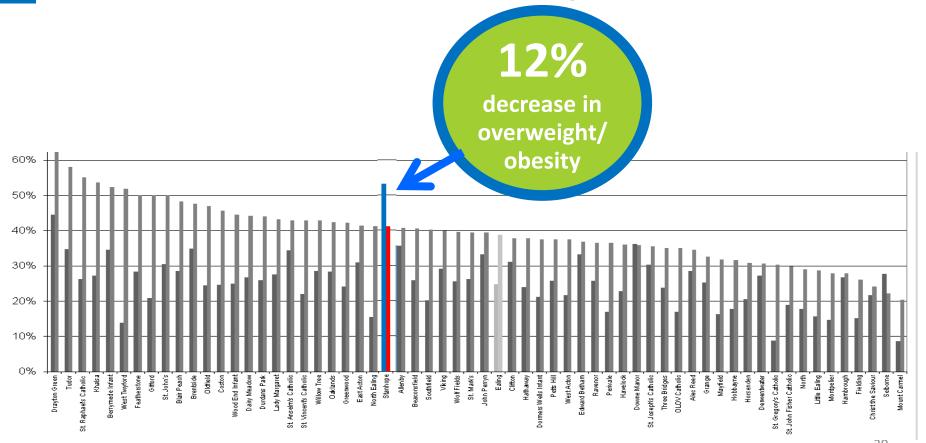
Data is <u>provisional</u> - data currently being queried as a number of schools have lower numbers of pupils measured than we would expect based on pupil numbers reported in schools census.

Vicars Green data not yet available.)

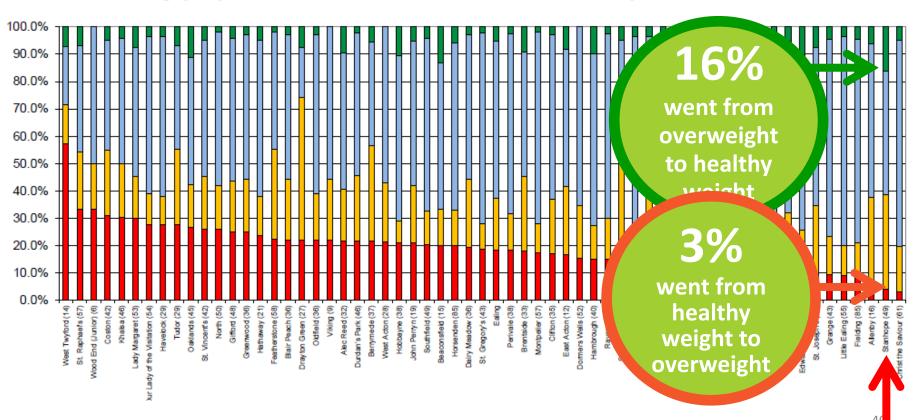
