This two part training is aimed at staff in schools who would like to gain an understanding into attachment in children, including:

- \* Knowledge of the different attachment styles and why they may develop

- \* Learning strategies to support children with an attachment need
- \* Receiving resources to implement strategies back in school

### ACTIVE LISTENING: LISTENING & TALKING EFFECTIVELY TO CHILDREN (2 PART COURSE)

The course is relevant for all staff working in schools wanting to gain more information and practice in this area. The course will also give participants all the resources necessary to enable them to set up and run a listening service for pupils for example a lunchtime self-referral drop-in.

The 2-part experiential active listening course for school staff will give participants: a basic understanding of neuroscience and what happens to a child's brain when they are angry; teach them how to help children regulate their emotions; share

ways we can listen more effectively and as a result have children listen to us; give the opportunity to practice techniques in a course environment and back in school.

### PLANNING & DELIVERING FRIENDSHIP GROUPS IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS (2 PART COURSE)

This is a two part course, during which participants will be provided with all the resources and materials necessary to deliver Friendship Groups in schools as well as having the opportunity to practice facilitation skills and build confidence to deliver this intervention with pupils.

The small group intervention (4-6 children) is designed to be delivered over a 6 week period and covers:

- Who are our friends?
- What do we look for in a friend?
- Accepting difference
- How do we talk to our friends?
- How do we listen to our friends?
- · What is conflict and how to deal with it
- What is peer pressure and how to deal with negative peer pressure
